## FYI:

- There's a Safeway only a few miles away in Williams
  - The campsite has bathrooms and water
  - Pack 478 reserved the "Group Area" for Friday, Saturday and Sunday evenings
  - Pancake breakfast is Sunday at 9:00am at the Sherwood Forest Fire Department
    - o Followed by a Firehouse tour then Geocache and educational nature hike
- **The entire weekend is only \$20 per family for all nights (not per night)**
  - **The remainder is subsidized by Pack 478 from fundraisers and dues**

**Overview:** Dogtown Lake got its name from the extensive prairie dog towns that once inhabited this area south of Williams. The campground now offers camping, picnicking, hiking, fishing and boating.

**Directions:** From Flagstaff, take I-40 west to Williams, turn south on 4th St. (County Road 73); go about 4 miles to FR 140; go left for about 3 miles to FR 132; go left again and follow the signs. – Phone (928) 699-1239

**Facilities:** 51 units with tables, fire rings, grills, vault toilets, garbage bins, water (May - Oct.), nature trail and dump station. Tents, trailers and small motor homes allowed; no hookups. Sites on a first-come first-served basis. Host on duty May - Oct.

**Elevation:** 7,000 feet. - **Fishing:** License required for anyone over 14. - **Boating:** Electric motors only (1 HP or less).
